
ST. PAUL'S MISSION STATEMENT

Updates from the March meeting (held February 23^{rd} .

Head Start/Early Intervention: Small plumbing issue fixed (parts needed to be replaced in toilet tank) and also exhaust fan needs motor replaced.

Fellowship: Working on plans for Confirmation reception (Pentecost Sunday) and also a end-of-Sunday School year picnic, scheduled for Sunday, June 5.

Health Ministry: Working on ideas for a healthrelated project for the spring & summer.

Christian Ed: Head Start Family gift project continues (gifts are due by Sunday, March 20); Palm Sunday Resurrection Eggs scavenger hunt being planned; May 29 will be last normal Sunday School session; plans for Vacation Bible School still in "the works."

Property: Besides Head Start restroom projects, two parking lot lights that were recently replaced are burnt out again - should be covered under warranty; new weather stripping was installed on front doors.

Worship & Music: Ash Wednesday - Morning meditation will include imposition of ashes by pastor and self-imposition of ashes will occur at the evening service; Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Vigil Services will be held at 7 pm; Easter Sunday - one service at 9:30 am. (Note: Zoom worship will continue for all services). Following discussion, committee affirmed their decision to add an opening hymn to the service but requesting that people who wish to sing to please wear a mask; committee looking into purchasing new, good quality, altar paraments - replacing some colors that have worn out.

Old Business: Council discussed ideas for using the year-end Christmas donation received (not to be used for general expenses) and decision was made to purchase a workstation for the parlor with remaining funds to be used towards updating office computer systems. New Business: Delegates needed to attend the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre Mission District meeting on Wednesday, April 27 at 7:00 pm (on-line meeting) and the Synod Assembly on Friday and Saturday, June 10-11 (on-line meeting).

Nominating Committee needs to be formed to submit names for council election in May. Outgoing council members are: Jon Moelling (final term); Don Pheasant (eligible to run for 2nd threeyear term); Joel Eneboe and Alice Baer (not running for 2nd term); also need two persons to fill one year term for Holly O'Brien (resignation) and Heidi Manning (moving to Iowa).

HOLY WEEK - EASTER SERVICES

Our return to baptism's promise and power for us that started with Ash Wednesday's call to repentance comes to a grand, full climax at the Great Three Days, or Triduum, and Easter's proclamation of the resurrection. The great good news of the empty tomb has serious implications for us. The baptismal gifts of eternal life, the power of the Holy Spirit in us, and forgiveness and freedom in the grace of God all find their source in God's raising Jesus from the dead. So we mark the moments along the way with liturgies unlike any other throughout the church year. We begin the week where Jesus began the week, entering Jerusalem in triumph, then quickly turning our liturgical attention to the reason he came to Jerusalem: his passion. Later in the week, we continue with the assurance of pardon and forgiveness, commitment to the life of love and

servanthood Jesus calls us to, and the beginning of the end with the Last Supper and stripping him and the sanctuary to its bareness on Maundy Thursday. We hear the story of his passion and death in a simple, intentional focus on that story on Good Friday. And gathering in the depths of death and darkness, we celebrate the light Jesus brings, hear the scripture stories that form our faith, affirm our own baptismal covenant, and celebrate the first announcement of the resurrection at Saturday's Easter Vigil. And finally, with abandon and joy, we gather Sunday morning to celebrate the Resurrection of Our Lord. The evening services, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday that form one continuous liturgy all begin at 7:00 pm. There is no 5:30 Saturday service that week. And we gather at 9:30 am, our regular Sunday worship time, for Easter good news, Christ is risen! We celebrate Palm/Passion Sunday at both our regular Saturday, 5:30 pm and Sunday 9:30 am worship services. Services will also be shown via Zoom.

Mission News

ELCA Global Mission's monthly newsletter, "Global Links," announced nine new missionaries beginning service,

including the new missionary who will coordinate the YAGM program in our companion synod, Argentina and Uruguay, Jessica Geroux. She joins new missionaries Jordan and Adam Miller-Stubbendick, Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM) country coordinators for Jerusalem/West Bank; Mytch Dorvilier, YAGM country coordinator for Senegal; Cory and Sarah Driver, directors of graduate studies in Egypt; and Vola Ranaivoson, ESL teacher in Japan. Rev. Rachael Ringlaben, who previously served in Argentina and Uruguay and who joined us for worship via Zoom during the height of the pandemic in July 2020, completed her term. In other work, Global Mission personnel are working with partner churches and organizations to empower women around the world. Several years ago, the EPES International Training program in Chile offered advocacy training to women in Kenya, Uganda and Zimbabwe. In fall 2021, several of these women leaders gathered virtually to assess the lessons they had learned and share how they had put them to use. Grace Mose, a participant from Nairobi, noted, "When we empower women, we are empowering the community. Women are the foundation of our communities and for change."
