
ST. PAUL'S MISSION STATEMENT

Updates from the May Council meeting held on May 3, 2022.

Communications: Committee provided publicity for the April Roast Beef Dinner & Dorcas' Rummage/Bake Sale. Also waiting for response regarding the website's domain name hosting in order to move website to WPEngine.

Landscaping: Weed & Feed fertilizer has been spread on various areas of the lawn.

Christian Education: Last day of Sunday School will be May 29th with a Marigold take home activity; committee is also investigating joining with Lehman Idetown Church for a Vacation Bible School program.

Head Start / Early Intervention: EI has requested the use of their current classroom space used for speech therapy be turned into a second permanent classroom; this request is due to the increase in children needing EI services. After listening to the EI representative who attended the council meeting and further discussion the request was granted. Finance will be reworking the EI lease to reflect the additional square footage being used.

Property: Work will begin on the Bell Tower repairs at the end of May; still waiting on word from DAMA regarding start date for repairs of water retention basins. Committee will be addressing roof repairs and seeking bids to determine cost for both the shingled & flat areas of the roof.

Long Range Planning: Final draft revisions to the church constitution have been mailed to council members, but further action was tabled until the new council members are seated.

Staff Support: The Administrative Assistant Search Committee has been reactivated; the previously rewritten job description will remain the same.

The Scranton/Wilkes-Barre Mission District met for its annual assembly Thursday, May 12 via Zoom. Bishop Christopher deForest led us in opening worship and shared greetings from his family vacation in Florida! Chair Elizabeth Keator and Dean Jira Albers led us in the business of the Mission District, Erika Mills was elected to the Mission District Council and Tina Baucher was elected to a one-vear term as Secretary. Treasurer Jim Doxey described complications with the passing of former Treasurer, Wayne Getz, announced that a letter will be sent to congregations describing new procedures for donations to the Mission District, and together with the executive committee presented a budget of \$3315, which was approved. And the assembly heard a presentation from the Susquehanna County Women's Resource Center Program Manager, Tiffany Benedict, about an expanding safe housing initiative, the increased demand for services, and the specific ways that the financial support of our Mission District helps women and children.

CELEBRATING THE CHURCH'S BIRTHDAY

On Pentecost, we remember when the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus' disciples. As they gathered in Jerusalem 10 days after Jesus' ascension, they saw tongues of fire, heard rushing wind and began speaking in many languages. Because the disciples could then share the good news with all the pilgrims assembled for the Pentecost festival, the occasion marks the birthday of the Christian church. That day alone, about 3,000 people devoted their lives to Christ.

Like the Holy Spirit, Pentecost is important and relevant today. As theologian Henri Nouwen writes, "Without Pentecost the Christ-even - the life, death and resurrection of Jesus - remains imprisoned in history as something to remember, think about and reflect on. The Spirit of Jesus comes to dwell within us, so that we can become living Christs here and now."


