
ST. PAUL'S MISSION STATEMENT

Updates from the February 6, 2024 meeting:

Pastor Grube reported that St. Paul's and Prince of Peace's congregations will hold common services for Good Friday and Easter Vigil, alternating locations and incorporating worship leaders from both congregations. On Ash Wednesday, Prince of Peace offered worship, imposition of ashes and Communion at 12:10 pm and 4:30 pm; St. Paul's services were 7:00-9:00 am and 7:00 pm. A complete list of shared services will be printed in future bulletins and the March newsletter.

Christian Education: The committee planned a series of activities, such as making Valentines for shut-ins on Feb. 4, Bible Bowl on Feb. 11, Bear Creek Camp Day on Feb. 18, a Palm Sunday craft on March 24, and the last day of Sunday School on May 19. Evangelism Committee: The committee handed out additional copies of the Reconciling in Christ Survey on Feb. 10-11, and requests that surveys from the February newsletter and in church be placed in the basket in the Narthex by Feb. 29. **Health Ministry:** The committee reported that they are considering two newer refurbished AED machines to replace the church's older device which is no longer useable. **Social Ministry**: The group will meet in March to assemble Easter baskets for our shut-ins. Finance: W2's were prepared and distributed to staff before January 31; all 4th gtr. 2023 local, state and federal tax forms were completed, paid and reconciliation reports submitted; Shepherd Staff Finance program was upgraded; 2023 audit is scheduled for the general fund (regular, savings and investments) and also for Brotherhood and Dorcas finances. Property: The drainage ditch work has been completed outside the sanctuary exit door, lighting control board in Sacristy has been repaired and drawing plans will be reviewed for Predella step railing when they are completed.

Vice-President Frank Mariano welcomed new members Amanda Brezovsky and Julie Holbrook to the council. The council re-elected Frank to the position of vice-president and Gail Smallwood to council secretary. Council members have been named to the following committees:

PROVE IT!

In *Jesus Christ, Superstar,* King Herod mocks the bound prisoner who's brought to his courtyard. "So, you are the Christ. You're the great Jesus Christ!" he sings. "Prove to me that you're no fool: Walk across my swimming pool!"

Likewise, the Pharisees demand evidence that Jesus is speaking for God (see Matthew 12:38). It's easy to poke fun at them, but have you ever faced a tough decision and thought, "If only God would give me a sign?"

Jesus tells the religious teachers about the "sign of Jonah," a metaphor for his upcoming death and resurrection. Though it's meant to be a sign for all, not everyone accepts it as truth. Luke 16:31 notes that if the rich man's brothers weren't predisposed to listen to Moses and the prophets, then "they will not be convinced even if someone rises from the dead (NIV). Signs are useful only to people who accept their messages and act accordingly.

OBSERVING LENT

As usual, we are providing resources for keeping a holy Lent at home as well as special opportunities for gathering in community this Lent. "Guided to the Cross" is a daily devotional booklet specifically for Lent which you can use in addition to the regular daily devotional booklet, "The Word in Season." Current seasonal copies of this regular resource are still available on the literature rack in the Narthex. There also are copies of the Lent booklet on the greeter's table as you come and go for worship. There are also two opportunities each week to gather with others this Lent. We are taking part in an ecumenical Soup and Scripture series each Wednesday evening, 6:00-7:30 pm, at one of our area churches. The host will provide a soup supper, then the host pastor will lead us in a Lenten-themed presentation. We will host the gathering March 20.

Our regular weekly Bible study, The Bible This Week, continues throughout the month to serve as your special opportunity for Lenten season Bible study. We gather Tuesday mornings at 10:30 to encounter together the scripture readings for the coming weekend's worship. The gospel of John will become our focus this month and we will continue our survey of covenant promises of God through the Old Testament readings. We enjoy fellowship after that with a brown-bag lunch at 11:45, with drink and dessert provided, and end our time at about 12:15 pm with a closing prayer service featuring a reflection from Martin Luther. We will not meet on Tuesday of Holy Week (March 26) and will take a short Easter break before resuming our weekly gatherings again from 10:30 to 11:30 am in April.

While you are always encouraged to take advantage of the services, events, and activities of our local community of churches, we have made an intentional effort this year to partner with Prince of Peace Episcopal Church, Dallas, to share our Lent and Holy Week services with one another. Even more, we will celebrate Good Friday and the Easter Vigil together, taking turns hosting those services and offering leadership from both congregations.

Our Good Friday service March 29 will be at noon at St. Paul's and our Easter Vigil service March 30 will be at 8:00 pm at Prince of Peace. Both services will share leadership, there will be a joint choir for the Easter Vigil service, and both services will feature preaching by the pastor of the other church, Father Joseph Rafferty at St. Paul's on Good Friday and Pastor Grube at Prince of Peace at the Easter Vigil.

Our weekly Bible This Week Bible study is open to members of Prince of Peace and their weekly Stations of the Cross on Fridays at 7:00 pm are open to us. St. Paul's will be hosting the Wednesday ecumenical Soup and Scripture gathering on March 20. Join with our brothers and sisters across our community of churches and see how rich our Lent and Holy Week can be together.

Members of St. Paul's are invited to serve as lectors for the Vigil Service on March 30 at Prince of Peace. Please contact Pastor Grube or the church office if you would like to volunteer.



This month St. Paul's will host the 2024 Women's World Day of Prayer service on Friday, March 1 at 1:00 pm. The annual

event, organized by area churches, is free and open to the public. The service is written by Christian women of Palestine and features a theme of "I beg you—bear with one another in love." The service will include a series of prayers, readings from the Bible, hymns and personal reflections by the writers. Light refreshments will be served following the service. The Women's World Day of Prayer is a global, ecumenical grassroots movement of Christian women. Its centerpiece is a church service in which the liturgy is prepared by women in a different country each year. It is celebrated worldwide on the first Friday in March. Christians of various denominations prepare this service together and everyone is invited.

Answer: A (See Philippians 2:10-11.)
