



### Updates from the April 2, 2024 meeting:

**Property and Finance Committees:** the Elderhorst Bell Company should be coming to the church during the first or second week of April to determine why the bell has not been working. The broken window in the Head Start classroom has been replaced; the window was damaged during a break-in attempt. Council received an estimate of \$4,500 to install outside security cameras and set up a monitor in the church office. Drawings for a new handrail for the predella have been approved and a search will begin for a tradesperson to build and install it. A plumber has been called to determine the source of a leak in the font.

**Worship and Music:** Pastor Grube noted the Holy Week collaboration with Prince of Peace Episcopal Church was successful, and more collaborative efforts between the two congregations will be explored.

**Health Ministry:** The new AED machine and bleeding kit have been received and installed. Gail Ide will work on setting up training sessions for CPR and the AED machine. **Fellowship:** the

committee will host a reception on May 19 for the church's three confirmands and will provide lunch for the Mission District Assembly at St. Paul's on Saturday, April 27.


May we continue to thrive as disciples of Jesus and bearers of God's word and life in the power of that Holy Spirit of God.
