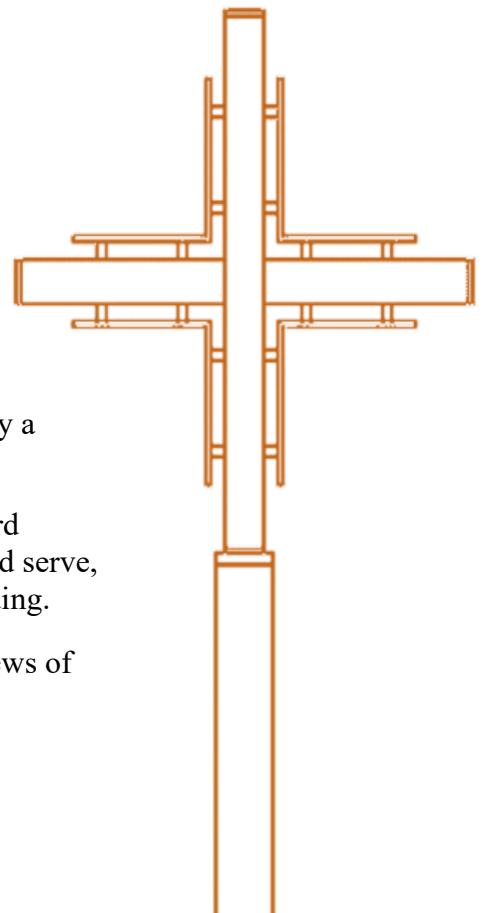
### ST. PAUL'S MISSION STATEMENT

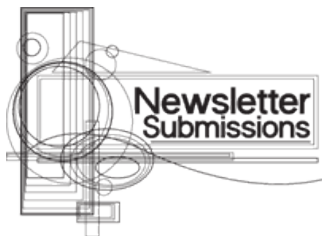

## SYNOD EVENTS

The Northeast PA Synod Assembly will be next month, Thursday to Saturday, June 4-6, but the work to prepare it has been fully underway for some time. This is a particularly important assembly because in addition to the usual business, reports, budget, and elections will be the election of the bishop.

The Synod Council has already surveyed the synod with an online questionnaire to determine the synod's needs, concerns, and priorities as a way to discern whom we might want to serve in that important office. Gail Ide and Marissa Miller will serve as our congregation's voting members.

There are also many opportunities for volunteers to assist the work of the assembly and volunteers are exempt from the registration fee. You can read more about the assembly and register as a visitor or volunteer on the synod's website under the "Events" tab, [nepasynod.org/assembly2026/](http://nepasynod.org/assembly2026/).

As the preparations continue, we encourage you to remember in your prayers our synod, the committees planning the assembly, and those who will be voting.

Once again, St. Paul's has been asked to serve as the host for a synod gathering this month. Pastors and Deacons who serve in already established or forming 6261 ministries regularly gather as a cohort for support and collegiality, spiritual growth and learning, and we will be hosting their next retreat Wednesday, May 13. This will be an easy one for us since it is simply providing the gathering space for their time, but it is one more reminder of the ministry we are able to do for the greater church beyond our congregational ministry.

Our church home has come to be an important resource for our synod and mission district for bringing people together, and that is something for which we can praise and thank God.



## BIBLE STUDY

Along with the Easter season, our Bible This Week weekly Bible Study will also wind down for the season. Our final study will be Tuesday, May 19 when we will look at the texts for Pentecost. In the meantime, we will continue to gather each week 10:30-11:30 am to read and share reflections on the scripture readings for the coming weekend's worship. We invite and encourage you to come and share your thoughts, insights, and questions. The texts are listed each week in the worship bulletin and will continue throughout the summer for your own devotional reading.

## REQUESTED RECIPE

COCONUT CREAM ICE CREAM DESSERT  
(served at April Dorcas meeting) by Lois Hardisky

Crush 60 Ritz crackers (use slightly salted). Melt one stick of butter then mix with crumbs. Save 1/3 cup for topping. Press remainder into 9 x 13 pan. Soften a half gallon vanilla ice cream at room temperature. Mix 1 1/2 cup milk with ice cream and add two small boxes of instant coconut cream pudding. Mix till smooth. Pour pudding/ice cream mixture on top of crust. Refrigerate till firm. Spread with Cool Whip (optional). Sprinkle with remaining crumbs. Enjoy!

Note: other flavors of pudding have been used successfully.

And that reminds me of those Blood Thirsty TICKS! Not only the adults, but those itchy, bitsy brand-new ones who are extremely hungry and going after anything warm blooded. And people talk about bears being hungry! They're nothing compared to ticks (and mosquitoes)!

Go to [pa.gov/agencies/health](http://pa.gov/agencies/health) and type in Ticks in the search box. Or go to [pa.gov/agencies/health/diseases-conditions/infectious-disease/vectorborne-diseases/tick-diseases](http://pa.gov/agencies/health/diseases-conditions/infectious-disease/vectorborne-diseases/tick-diseases). You can find prevention methods, tick removal, the different kinds of ticks and where they're found, diseases with symptoms, and more. I hope these resources are helpful.

Would you believe there is even a very informative Tick Calendar? You can find it by typing "Tick Calendar" in the search box at [pa.gov/agencies/health](http://pa.gov/agencies/health).

Sorry about being so against ticks, but I've had the "bull's eye" rash and had to go on antibiotics. They are not my friends. Neither are mosquitoes, who come from miles around to get me!

## BEAR CREEK CAMP NEWS

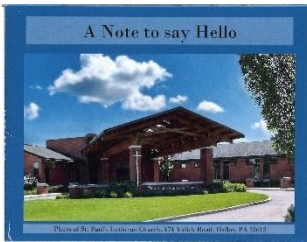
Bear Creek Camp shared some significant statistics in its recent newsletter about the effectiveness of church camp.

"As staff, we have the privilege of seeing firsthand the growth and development of each camper — not only from one summer to the next, but often within just a week. We know that camp is more than just a fun place to spend the summer — it's where kids explore nature, build meaningful friendships, grow in confidence, overcome challenges, and develop lasting resilience. Research also reinforces what we see every day. The American Camp Association's Youth Outcomes Study confirms that camp is a unique and powerful force in youth development — giving kids the chance to connect with peers from all walks of life and push past their own boundaries. These aren't small moments; they're the building blocks of who a child becomes."

Here are some of the ACA Study's findings: 96 percent of campers reported that camp helped them make new friends, 93 percent said camp helped them to get to know kids who are different from them, 92 percent reported that the people at camp helped them feel good about themselves, and 74 percent reported that they did things they were afraid to do at first.

Your support of Bear Creek Camp is so important to so many children and youth whose lives are impacted by their experience at camp. Thank you.

## MOTHER — AND MORE

Though I've primarily known God as Father — along with metaphors such as rock, eagle, shepherd, potter — I also learned of Scripture passages portraying God as mother. For example (all NIV):

- "For a long time, I have kept silent. ... But now, like a woman in childbirth, I cry out, I gasp and pant" (Isaiah 42:14).
- "As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you" (Isaiah 66:13).
- "Like a bear robbed of her cubs, I will attack them" (Hosea 13:8).
- In others, God is pictured doing traditional "women's work": making clothes (Genesis 3:21), sweeping (Isaiah 14:23), preparing and hosting a meal (Proverbs 9:1-6), baking bread (Luke 13:21).

• One of my favorite images of God is tucked in Hosea. While many modern dads nurture their toddlers this way, the tender words surely call to mind a mama's care: "It was I who taught [Israel] to walk. ... To them I was like one who lifts a little child to the cheek, and I bent down to feed them" (Hosea 11:3-4). Most importantly, God — however known — is loving and good.
